Speaker: Christian von Delius.

Christian has been flying since the age of 12, has built his own hang glider, has a degree in flight technology, is currently building a Grumman Yankee, and is a commercial pilot.

Christian fascinated us with a presentation about a plane he is interested in building called a CriCri. It is the world's smallest twin, trailer-able, and is ready in 2 minutes after unloading from a trailer. It uses 2 15-horse engines, takes off in 350 feet, and is an aerobat. Its weight is 172#, cruises at 130 mph, rated to 9Gs, climbs at 130 fpm, stalls at 45 mph, holds 23 liters of fuel, and has a take-off weight of 375#. The plane is plan built and was originally designed in France. There are currently about 20 in the USA and about 3-400 in Europe and around the world. The plans are not available here. He estimated the cost to build one to be about \$15-20,000.
