This month it is:</p> <p>Larry Sivertson</p>  <p>1. Tell us about yourself. <i>I was trained as an electrical engineer, and got into software engineering early in my career. I worked in that field for about 30 years, but was ready for a change. I began a website called Hearing Loss Web, and was involved in the establishment of a local non-profit called Hearing Loss Network. Between them they keep me pretty busy. I also enjoy working out and playing the guitar.</i></p> <p>2. Tell us about your hearing loss. <i>I had fairly normal hearing most of my life. I first became aware of my hearing loss when a friend commented that I couldn't hear her when we were talking in a noisy room. I had a hearing test, and sure enough, I had a severe high frequency hearing loss. I don't wear hearing aids yet, but the day can't be far off. It's interesting noticing my declining hearing while wife Char's is improving with her cochlear implant. She recently called me to come and listen to the crickets, which she hadn't been able to hear for many years. Try as I might, I couldn't hear any crickets! Frankly, I think Char kind of enjoys my being hard of hearing, on top of a lifetime of being hard of listening.</i></p> <p>3. How has hearing loss affected your life. <i>My hearing loss isn't enough of an issue yet to have had a big effect on my life. But Char's certainly has! It led me to become deeply involved in hearing loss about 15 years ago. It soon became an avocation that has continued up to the present.</i></p> <p>4. How did you become involved in HLAA? <i>Char and I found the local chapter of the Association of Late Deafened Adults (ALDA) back in 1996 after her hearing had taken a big drop. We got so much support and learned so much. A couple of years ago, our chapter switched our affiliation to the Hearing Loss Association of America (HLAA) to take advantage of some of the chapter support they offered. 
