# **Hugo Tombstone Quarry Section of Applegate Trail**

#### **Hugo Tombstone Quarry Section Of Applegate**

Trail<sup>1-4</sup> The approximate 1.5 miles of the Hugo Tombstone Quarry Section (*Quarry Section*) of the Applegate Trail is from the East I-5 Manzanita Rest Stop in the south to the 1880s emigrant Pleasant Valley Cemetery (PVC) in the north, Josephine County, Oregon. This trail segment includes the *Hugo Granite Tombstone Quarry Site* and hence the name for this segment of the trail.

Historic Places Nomination A project of the Hugo Neighborhood, Hugo Emigrant Trails Committee (HETC); Josephine County Historical Society (JCHS); and Rogue (RA) Advocates is to determine the significance of *Quarry Section* of the Applegate Trail. The method is the compliance process of nominating the *Quarry Section* to the National Park Service (through the Oregon State Historic Preservation Office) for consideration of listing to the National Register of Historic Places (*National Register*).

**Historic Places Nomination Process**<sup>6-7</sup> The *National Register* project to nominate the *Quarry Section* of the Applegate Trail to the *National Register* will have three major elements.


- . Inventory
