TIGHTENING OUR BELT

We've suffered cutbacks in funding from county and federal programs totaling \$7,000 this year. We are concerned about the possibility of further cutbacks as the government renews efforts to cut spending. We're asking everyone to let their congressmen know how essential our Food Bank is to our community.

We just spent the last of the funds from the



Vitamin Consumer Cases Fund which enabled us to buy extra-nutritious food for our clients. We would love to find a replacement funding source of \$7,500 so we can continue giving our clients a bag of brown rice or beans every week of the year.
